Sean Smith is a retired police officer with over 27 years of public service in Carbon County. Sean is a graduate of Lehigh Area School District and has resided in the Panther Valley area since 1997. Sean graduated with his ACT 120 certification from Lackawanna Junior College in 1994 and attended Penn State Outreach Justice and Safety Institute. There he performed specialized investigations into narcotics-related crimes. This work enabled him to network with several agencies such as ATF (Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms), Office of the Bureau of Narcotics, Pennsylvania State Police, and the Pennsylvania Game Commission. Sean is committed to applying the law to narcotic crimes committed in the District as his #1 priority. His work with all the local District Magistrates has given him the experience of the court system which is a valuable asset to this office. The knowledge he has gained from executing search warrants, criminal arrests, and summary hearings equip him with expert knowledge of the due process of law. Sean has done extensive work with the current and former District Attorneys, which is also a benefit to the residents of this District.
